

# Free Nevada Liquor License Checklist

Your Step-by-Step Guide to Getting Approved Without the Headaches

| Step 1: | Determi | ne the l | License | Type |

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| otop 1. Betermine the Election Type  |
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| Choose the correct license before you begin—this affects everything.   |
| <ul> <li>☐ Importer/Wholesaler License</li> <li>☐ Manufacturer License</li> <li>☐ Retail License (via local city/county)</li> </ul>  |
| <b>Tip</b> : If you sell alcohol directly to customers (bars, restaurants, etc.), you need a retail license from the city or county.   |
| Step 2: Check Local Requirements   |
| Every city/county has unique rules. Before applying:   |
| <ul> <li>□ Confirm zoning laws allow alcohol sales</li> <li>□ Apply for a local business license</li> <li>□ Pass fire, health, and safety inspections</li> <li>□ Schedule city council or zoning board reviews (if applicable)</li> </ul>  |
| Step 3: Gather Required Documents  |
| Prepare these <b>before</b> applying to avoid delays:  |
| <ul> <li>□ Completed Nevada Liquor License Application</li> <li>□ Nevada Business Registration Certificate</li> <li>□ Business Tax Permit</li> <li>□ Federal TTB Approval</li> <li>□ Fictitious Firm Name Certificate (DBA)</li> <li>□ Personal history/background forms for all owners</li> </ul> |



| <ul><li>☐ Floor plan or site layout (some localities require this)</li><li>☐ Lease or deed for business location</li></ul>  |
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| Step 4: Submit the Application  |
| Where to submit depends on your business type and location:   |
| <ul><li>☐ Submit to Nevada Department of Taxation (Manufacturer/Importer)</li><li>☐ Submit to City or County Board (Retail License)</li></ul>   |
| Cities requiring city board review (check if applicable):   |
| <ul> <li>□ Las Vegas</li> <li>□ Reno</li> <li>□ North Las Vegas</li> <li>□ Henderson</li> <li>□ Carson City</li> <li>□ Sparks</li> <li>□ Mesquite</li> <li>□ Fallon</li> <li>□ Ely</li> <li>□ Elko</li> </ul> |

## **Step 5: Pay All Fees**

Double-check all required fees:

| License Type               | State Fee |
|----------------------------|-----------|
| Importer (Beer Only)       | \$150     |
| Importer (All Alcohol)     | \$500     |
| Wholesaler (Beer Only)     | \$75      |
| Wholesaler (All Alcohol)   | \$250     |
| Brewpub / Brewery / Winery | \$75      |
| Rectifier / Distiller      | \$550     |

| □ Local city/c | ounty license fees    | (often \$500-\$5,000+ | annually) |

Pro Tip: Pay fees before July 1st annually to avoid license cancellation.

### Step 6: Secure a Liquor Surety Bond

Bond is required to protect the state and ensure tax compliance.

| Bond Type                    | Amount Required |
|------------------------------|-----------------|
| Beer Only (Wholesale)        | \$10,000        |
| All Alcohol (Wholesale)      | \$50,000        |
| Brewer / Winemaker / Brewpub | \$1,000         |
| Rectifier                    | \$50,000        |

| ☐ Work with a licensed surety provider                       |  |

| ☐ Pay premium (usually 1–15% of bond value, based on credit) |  |

#### **Step 7: Final Approval + License Display**

| Once approved:  |
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| ☐ Receive and prominently display liquor license☐ Pay annual renewal fees (before July 1) |
| ☐ Track deadlines to avoid cancellation   |
| ☐ Set up reminders for next year's renewal  |

#### **Ongoing Maintenance**

| □ Renew license annually                               |
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| □ Pay all taxes and fees on time                       |
| □ Update zoning/city changes if expanding or relocatin |
